Spring Membership & Election Dinner Speaker, Amy Nash

Amy Nash, a 1980 ACS graduate, was diagnosed with End Stage Renal Disease during her senior year in college. She was on peritoneal dialysis for four months, and at age 23 received her first kidney transplant in 1986 from a 20-year-old donor killed in a car accident. Post-transplant, Amy was director of marketing for Skis Dynastar and Lange Ski Boots for 12 years, overseeing the advertising and promotion of its products and Olympic and World Cup athletes.



After 21 years, her transplant failed and Amy returned to peritoneal dialysis in July 2007. A dozen friends were tested as potential living donors, and one dating back to her childhood in Alden, Maureen Wirth, proved to be a match. In a testament to the success of living donation, Maureen ran the New York City Marathon 11 months after donating her kidney to Amy in December 2008.

In celebration of her two transplants, Amy has raised over \$25,000 for the National Kidney Foundation of Western New York to help patients like herself. NKF honored her with its Extraordinary Achievement Award in 2007.

In 2008, Amy was invited to Washington, D.C., to speak with Congressional staffers in an effort to ensure passage of the 2008 Medicare Health Act, one of the last bills Ted Kennedy championed and voted for. Amy was able to do dialysis between meetings in Congressional offices, and her advocacy on Capitol Hill remains one of her proudest achievements.

In 2013, Amy was chosen to ride on the Donate Life float in the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California, with other organ recipients, donor families, and advocates from across the U.S. As a National Donate Life Ambassador, Amy continues to volunteer with Unyts, the WNY Organ Procurement Organization (OPO), as a way to thank her two kidney donors. She uses her marketing and public speaking background to put a face on organ transplantation and kidney disease to educate others. Amy speaks as often as possible to increase awareness for organ, eye, tissue and blood donation at schools, corporations, religious groups, civic organizations, and to the print, broadcast, and electronic media.

Amy and her husband Jerry, a fellow 1980 ACS classmate, reside in Clarence with their son, Nicholas Colombo.

CANCELLATION GUIDELINES FOR MEMBERS WITH HEALTH INSURANCE


The Alden Chamber of Commerce bills subscribers of our health insurance program in advance on a quarterly basis. It's important to remember that if you find that you will be canceling that policy I or 2 months into the quarter, you will be reimbursed for any unused month in that quarter. The billing cycle goes from the first of a month to the first of the next month etc.

It is important and to your advantage to pay your premium on time. Late payers will be assessed a late fee of \$25. If your payment is not received in the Chamber office by the end of the month in which payment is due, your policy will be cancelled and reinstatement cannot be attained until September 1, our open enrollment. If your payment will be late call the Chamber office at 937-6177 to make arrangements.

Also be advised that the Alden Chamber of Commerce must be notified in order to cancel a health insurance. policy. You are responsible for health insurance premiums until we are notified otherwise. We know that routine cancellations will happen so please help us by phoning in your plan cancellations as soon as possible. We have a limited time to go back to cancel subscribers; even one day over the limited window of time and you could be responsible for premiums you do not want to pay.

Any changes to your health insurance such as cancellation, marriage, divorce, birth of a child or the death of anyone covered by the policy must be reported to the Chamber office within 30 days of the event.

ALDEN FARMERS MARKET OPENS MAY 17

Spring is finally here! Despite the long, cold, snowy winter ... the 12th season of Alden's Farmers Market will open on May 17. As usual, we'll have a small crafts show — the first of several throughout the season. The Farmers Market is sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce.

On May 24, a local author will join us for a book signing, in addition to crafts! And the 31st will also include soil testing by Master Gardeners. Be sure to bring a small clean bag of your garden's soil, for the \$3.00 testing. The formal entertainment season opens on June 7 with the very talented young jazz musicians from the Alden High and Middle Schools.

The Farmers Market will run every Saturday through October 11. We will again set up in the Alden Village Plaza, a little closer to Broadway but very near last year's location.

Early produce is limited, although asparagus, rhubarb, some leafy greens and early peas may be in; along with potatoes and onions. Of course, early season sales aren't limited to a few vegetables and fruits. Market stalls should be overflowing with plants, shrubs, and vegetable & herb starts to get the home gardens going.
